Note:

This index is a work in progress. The index will be updated cumulatively on an issue by issue basis. Retrospective cumulation will be undertaken as time permits. This version covers Nos. 113 (April 2010) through to 160 (February/March 2018).

Article titles are in single quotes. Titles of books, periodicals, newspapers and other media works are in italics. Regular features (e.g. SPITALFIELDS LIFE) are in capitals. Reviews of books are indexed under BOOK REVIEWS, under author, and where appropriate under one or more subject headings. Articles are indexed by subject heading and chronologically by date of publication under author name.

Page references are given in the format: number.page(s), for example, **135.16–20** signifies issue No. 135 pages 16 to 20. An 'L' in brackets after the page reference indicates a letter to the editor.

Photographic or illustrative material has generally not been indexed.

In issue No. 129, two sets of pages are numbered 50 to 60; the second set should actually be 65 to 75. Material appearing on a misnumbered page is signified by an underlined page reference, e.g. 129:53–54.
